ADRIAN INITIATIVE UPDATE

Over the last 4 months, Pastor Nate has had more than 40 meetings with people who live and work in Adrian. The more we learn, the more we are convinced of the need for a church planting effort focused on helping people grow personally, connect relationally, and engage missionally in Christ. While there is a great number of churches in Adrian, as one pastor of a large church in town said, "Even if every church loaded it's services to capacity, we still would only be scratching the surface." And considering that less than 40% of the almost 40,000 people in and around the city of Adrian are affiliated with any kind of church, he's right. Adrian has been hit hard in the past decade. It's a small town with its fair share of city-sized issues. There is diversity and division. There are bright spots and real educational and economic challenges. It's a community in redefinition. Some are pessimistic, others optimistic. It's filled with people who have tried church at one time or another and likely know a thing or two about Jesus. But for many, to say they have a church home or are experiencing life in Christ...well that's a stretch.

So what's next? The Hamblin's have secured a buyer for their home and are in the process of purchasing a home in Adrian. The focus this summer will be meeting people--developing relational routines and immersing into the community. Later in the fall, some informal gatherings may begin. And as people start to gather, the strategy and vision for moving forward will begin to form. Whatever we do, we want to work hard at *being* the church in Adrian, before we get too focused on simply *having* church services in Adrian.

Pastor Nate will be sharing more about Adrian--what we're learning and the approach we're taking--in the Heritage Connecting Community on May 10 in the chapel, and in the message on Sunday, May 31 entitled "Living Responsively."

TRI-STATE CO-OP

Crossroads has taken the lead to pull like-minded congregations together into a Tri-State Church Planting Cooperative composed of Crossroads, Archbold Evangelical Church, Solid Rock Church in West Unity, Sonlight in Angola, IN, King's Cross in Defiance, and Crossroads Napoleon. These congregations will cooperate to fund, resource and develop leaders who can lead planting initiatives in the tri-state area. The co-op has been identified as an official Fellowship of Evangelical Churches initiative, which allows any church within FEC to support the co-op financially. The co-op will be supporting plants in: Deshler, OH and Reading, Waldron, and Adrian, MI.
