# **Leadership Development Resident**

Blake Cooper will begin on April 1<sup>st</sup> as Crossroads' newest Leadership Development Resident. Unlike our other Resident Pastors, Blake is not a lead church planter but rather a gifted worship leader who can resource multiple planting initiatives. Blake has been developing and leading the worship band at Wave Church in Deshler under Alex Ruhter's leadership. As a resident with flexibility to help multiple church plants Blake will also develop and lead a worship band for the Adrian initiative and other future church planting initiatives.

In 2014, God used a friendship with Matt Strader to stir Blake's heart to move to northwest Ohio. Blake got a job at a local bank but has attended and served within the Crossroads network of churches since moving to northwest Ohio early last year. Blake will engage in LDR orientation and phase 1 of the residency this spring and summer while continuing to lead worship at Wave in Deshler. Blake will also develop Crossroads' youth band working under Matt Strader's leadership. He will also be engaged in discipleship and perhaps some teaching ministry.
